## SAFETY NET FOR RETRENCHED WORKERS

**T**HE Employment Insurance Scheme, proposed by the Malaysian Trades Union Congress (MTUC) since the 1990s, is materialising as the government is proposing a bill to that effect in Parliament in June.

The scheme aims to benefit retrenched workers. The establishment of a fund for the purpose will add a financial burden to employers as they already pay for Employees Provident Fund and Social Security Organisation (Socso), with some contributing to the Human Resources Development Fund, insurance for foreign workers and medical benefits, among others.

Therefore, to compel employers to contribute to another fund will add to their costs. Furthermore, not every company re-

trenches; it would be unfair to expect all companies to contribute to the said fund.

I had the opportunity to interview the late Tan Sri Harun Hashim, a former Supreme Court judge, when he was the dean of the Ahmad Ibrahim Kulliyah of Laws, International Islamic University Malaysia.

He had suggested that every individual, on turning 18, should register with Socso by paying a minimal fee. The person should be given a reference number or a card. He need not pay anything as he is not yet employed and may pursue his studies. When the time comes for him to take up employment, he will not be employed unless he had registered with Socso. He will have to produce his Socso card to activate his account.

Harun also said Socso was a good scheme that should cover the entire working population. When a person is injured, he will need medical care, and when he is hospitalised, he would only need to produce his Socso card. Rather than burden the government, the funds would come from Socso, enabling the public to obtain better medical facilities.

Similarly, when a person is retrenched, the retrenchment benefits should be paid out by Socso on a weekly basis for a period of time, perhaps for a maximum of 12 weeks, a reasonable period for a person to seek alternative employment. If the person has obtained employment within the period, the payments will cease. This is like a safety net.

There are cases where, for example, an employer cannot afford to pay his workers when they are retrenched because the factory has been destroyed in a fire. Through this arrangement, the workers can receive some form of payment.

In the case of errant employers who might abuse the scheme, for example, by dismissing workers, Harun was of the view that such employers should be prosecuted in court, and if such an employee was dismissed under Section 20(1) of the Industrial Relations Act 1967, he should be awarded a higher amount of compensation if he succeeded in his claim.

Employers who have a genuine need to retrench will be assisted by the fund. Those who choose not to retrench will benefit as they will gain the respect of employees who, in turn, will remain loyal to the company, thereby increasing productivity.

If a good employer faces difficulty, for example, if his premises is wiped out in a fire, the fund will come in handy. So, in the long run, he does not lose anything.

A trade unionist once said employers must not make the mistake of being penny wise and pound foolish by not wanting to contribute a mere 50 sen per worker towards the establishment of the fund. By ensuring that there is a social security safety net to protect the nation's workforce, employers would be protecting their businesses in times of economic uncertainty.

### Majikan halang solat, guna telefon bimbit

**Malak Meriangi** Dilang solat, masalah gaji akan ditolak RMI,000 sekiranya dikesan menggunakan telefon bimbit. Itu kasih 26 wanita wargasing berusia 20 hingga 42 tahun yang dipaksa bekerja sebagai cabang caci selak tiga tahun lalu sebelum mereka beralih diadunakkan dalam satu serbuan di sebuah premis rumah kedai di sini pada jam 6 petang, kelmarin.

Semua wanita berasal dari Indonesia ini dipercayai di kurung di premis milik sebuah syarikat membekalkan kerja lapan jam sehari sebelum dibayar RM30 walaupun majikannya mengenakan bayaran RM120 terhadap pelanggan.

Teru baal dengan mangsa merodatkan mereka di arahkan bekerja setiap hari tanpa cuti, tidak dibenarkan bergerak ke mana mana, tidak dibenarkan berhadapan pada waktu siang serta tidak dibenarkan menggunakan telefon bimbit.

Selain itu, mereka tidak dibenarkan memiliki wang dalam simpanan sendiri, menerima gaji hanya melalui resit tanpa menerima wang tunai dan jika melakukan kesalahan, gaji akan dipotong dan dipaksa untuk bekerja lebih masa.

Ketika Polis Daerah Seberang Perai Tengah Assisten Komisioner Nik Ros Azhan Nik Ab Hamid berkata, semua wanita berkenaan dilahirkan di dalam bilik yang dibekalkan di situ.

Belau berkata, dalam serbuan itu, pihaknya menahan tiga wanita termasuk seorang wargasing dipercayai penanya kepada pekerja wanita berkenaan ketika mereka berhadapan di kaunter.

"Hadi pemeriksaan polis menemui slip gaji diwakili milik pekerja serta 41 keping kad perakuan diperayai milik wanita berkenaan.

"Ketika melakukan pemeriksaan di hari-hari hagian atas premis, kami menemui 26 wanita warga Indonesia berada di bilik masing-masing dan hasil teru baal ringkas yang dilakukan polis terhadap mereka mendapati wujud unsur, pemerdagangan manusia," katanya.

Nik Ros Azhan berkata mereka kemudiannya dibawa ke Ibu Pejabat Polis Daerah Seberang Perai Tengah bagi tindakan seterusnya dan tiga wanita yang dihalau di kaunter premis itu, disiasat kerana menyalakan aktiviti "memperdagangkan manusia".

Belau berkata, ketiga-tiga mereka dihalau mengikut Seksyen 12, Akta Anti Perdagangan Orang dan Anti Pemukiman Migran (ATIPSOM) 2007 manakala 26 wanita ini diadunakkan daripada diperdagangkan untuk tujuan eksploitasi buntut mengikut Seksyen 41 ATIPSOM 2007.

"Hadi serbuan awal mendapati syarikat ini menyalakan perkhidmatan tukang caci dari rumah ke rumah dan bekerja mendakwa mereka darabkan belesgi setiap hari tanpa cuti dan tidak dibenarkan bergerak ke mana mana serta tidak dibenarkan berhadapan pada waktu siang."

"Selain itu, mereka juga tidak dibenarkan menggunakan telefon bimbit serta tidak dibenarkan menyimpan wang sendiri," katanya.

Nik Ros Azhan berkata, mangsa hanya menerima gaji melalui resit dan tidak menerima wang tunai, malah sekiranya mangsa melakukan kesalahan, gaji mereka akan dipotong RM100.

Belau berkata, mereka di paksa bekerja lebih masa setiap dua hingga tiga tahun lalu demi menguntungan syarikat mengizinkan mereka itu.

Menyentuh semua wanita berkenaan dibawa untuk pemeriksaan kesihatan sebelum dibenarkan ke rumah perindungan di Kuala Lumpur.

Sementara itu, tiga suspek terbit yang dibawa ke Maki kamah Maistret, di sini, dibenarkan ditahan remain untuk membantu siasatan selama dua hari sehingga hari ini.

## Polis selamatkan 26 wanita Indonesia didera majikan

**SEBERANG PERAI** – Seramai 26 wanita warga Indonesia yang dipercayai menjadi mangsa pemerdagangan manusia diselamatkan dalam operasi khas oleh Ibu Pejabat Polis Daerah Seberang Perai Tengah (SPT) di

Jalan Kulim, Bukit Mertajam di sini kelmarin.

Mereka dipercayai dipaksa bekerja tanpa diberikan cuti selain tidak dibenarkan menggunakan telefon bimbit dan beribadat pada waktu siang oleh sebuah

syarikat berkaitan pembersihan.

Difahamkan, ketika diselamatkan kira-kira pukul 6 petang, mereka yang sebahagiannya mempunyai dokumen perjalanan yang sah itu berada dalam keadaan trauma dan kebanyakan

nya menangis teresak-esak.

Ketua Polis Daerah SPT, Nik Ros Azhan Nik Ab. Hamid berkata, pihaknya turut menahan dua wanita tempatan berusia 47 dan 58 tahun bersama seorang wanita Indonesia berusia 46 tahun

yang dipercayai penjaga premis.

Nik Ros Azhan berkata, siasatan mendapati mangsa disuruh bekerja sebagai tukang pembersihan dari rumah ke rumah dan telah bekerja dalam tempoh antara dua hingga tiga tahun.
