Combodian maids coming back to Malaysia, soon.



KUALA LUMPUR: Cambodian domestic workers are like to return soon to Malaysia. Human Resources Minister Datuk Seri Richard Riot Jaem hinted that the return of maids from the Asean nation will be soon. Cambodian Prime Minister Hun Sen had, in October 2011, suspended Cambodia's sending domestic workers to Malaysia after a raft of reports of domestic worker abuse by both Malaysian employers and Cambodian recruitment agencies.

Richard said a joint technical committee has been formed between Malaysia and Cambodia to iron out issues, allowing the return of Cambodian maids after a six year ban. He said a meeting involving the joint committee will be held in Phnom Penh soon to finalise an agreement on recruitment, training and employment conditions.

"I just had a very fruitful discussion with Cambodian Labour and Vocational Training minister in Phnom Penh and we have instructed for a joint committee to be set up to come up with the dates on when the first batch of Cambodian domestic workers will arrive here. Richard said the Human Resources ministry, Cambodia's Ministry of Labour and Vocational Training as well as the Malaysian Home Ministry will attend the meeting, expected to be held before Ramadan.

Kemboja Tarik Balik Larangan Bekal Pembantu Rumah



PHNOM PENH: Kerajaan Kemboja menarik balik larangan yang dikenakan kepada rakyatnya untuk bekerja sebagai pembantu rumah di Malaysia menjelang akhir bulan ini. Lapor Bangkok Post, perjumpaan dua hala antara Menteri Buruh Kemboja, Ith Samheng dan Menteri Sumber Manusia, Datuk Richard Riot Jaem di Phnom Penh, bersetuju untuk menamatkan larangan tersebut yang berkuatkuasa sejak 2011.

Sebelum ini, Perdana Menteri Kemboja, Hun Sen memperkenalkan larangan tersebut ekoran kebimbangan terhadap situasi kerja dihadapi oleh rakyatnya termasuklah dipaksa berkerja selama 20 jam sehari, mengalami kebuluran dan penderaan fizikal. Sewaktu larangan itu dikuatkuasakan, kira-kira hampir 300,000 warga Kemboja bekerja sebagai pembantu rumah di Malaysia. - *Agensi*
