Tanah runtuh : Perkeso serahkan wang pampasan kepada keluarga mangsa



PENGURUS Pejabat Perkeso Georgetown, Shaharuddin Waled menyampaikan faedah pengurusan mayat kepada Yeow Chooi Keng iaitu ibu kepada mendiang Yuan Kuok Wern mangsa tragedi tanah runtuh di Tanjung Bungah baru baru ini, di Sungai Ara Pulau Pinang hari ini.

PULAU PINANG - Pertubuhan Keselamatan Sosial (Perkeso) cawangan George Town hari ini menyerahkan pampasan pengurusan mayat berjumlah RM2,000 kepada waris Yuan Kuok Wern yang terkorban dalam kejadian tanah runtuh di Tanjung Bungah pada Sabtu lalu.

Pengurusnya, Shaharuddin Waled berkata, ibu bapa mangsa juga akan menerima pencen bulanan sepanjang hayat berjumlah RM1,062 sebulan. Sementara itu, ibunya, Yeow Chooi Keng, 61, yang menerima cek berkenaan di rumah mereka di Sungai Ara, di sini hanya mampu mengucapkan terima kasih dan terus masuk ke dalam rumah.

Dalam kejadian kira-kira pukul 8.30 pagi di tapak pembinaan di Jalan Lembah Permai di Tanjung Bungah, Kuok Wern, 27, bersama 10 pekerja asing maut apabila anah runtuh menimbusi kawasan berkenaan ketika mereka sedang melakukan kerja-kerja pembinaan di situ.

EIS is new protection for workers

KUALA LUMPUR : The Malaysian Trades Union Congress (MTUC) which represents half a million private sector employees sees the Employment Insurance System (EIS) as a new protection for workers. The EIS Bill was passed by the Dewan Rakyat last night. MTUC president Abdul Halim Mansor in welcoming law makers approval of the bill said the introduction of the EIS was also timely now, considering the soft job market and tough global economic climate.

"MTUC thanks Prime Minister, YB Human Resource and MOHR, Employer Association and Tan Sri Zainal Rahim KPPA for all the effort," he said in a statement today. "Though it has been nearly 20 years since the idea of a "safety net" for retrenched workers was first mooted, notably after over 50,000 people loss their jobs following the 1997 Asian Financial Crisis, the Malaysian Employers Federation (MEF) feels the Federal government pushed through the policy without taking into account the views of employers.

"On the other side of the fence, the Malaysian Trades Union Congress (MTUC), which represents over 500,000 private sector employees sees the EIS as a "New Protection", " he said. Under the EIS bill, employers and employees will contribute 0.2 per cent each of an employee's salary, which will go towards an accumulated fund, where retrenched workers could claim financial assistance from. The scheme will involve 430,000 employers and 6.6 million employees.

Abdul Halim said under the existing Employment Act 1955, the only retrenchment benefits workers get are 10 days salary for under two years of service, 15 days salary for under five years of service and 20 days salary for anything above that. "But currently, this is lopsided because if an employee suddenly quits his job without serving notice, he would be expected to pay the company a month's wages", he said. He adds that under the Employment Act, companies were also required to have reserves for retrenchment benefits, though this had not been enforced by the federal government. "At the end of the day, it's a fund for protection. Just like automotive insurance. You pay for insurance but only claim when there's an accident, and the contribution rate of 0.2 per cent is a small and fair amount for this protection," he said.

Buruh Bangladesh cedera, alang konkrit runtuh

IPOH : Seorang buruh warga Bangladesh cedera pada tangan dan kaki dalam kejadian runtuh alang konkrit rumah yang sedang dibina di kawasan perumahan berdekatan sebuah sekolah antarabangsa di Meru Raya di sini, hari ini.

Dalam kejadian jam 1.30 tengah hari itu, mangsa yang dikenali sebagai Rukun berusia 30-an berjaya diselamatkan oleh rakan sekerjanya sebelum dibawa keluar di dibawa ke Hospital Raja Permaisuri Bainun (HRPB) untuk menerima rawatan lanjut. Ketua Zon 1 Jabatan Bomba dan Penyelamat Malaysia (JBPM) Perak, Mohd Khairul Jamil, berkata Balai Bomba dan Penyelamat Meru Raya menerima panggilan kecemasan kejadian itu pada jam 1.45 tengah hari.

"Kejadian ini membabitkan seorang mangsa warga Bangladesh yang cedera pada kaki dan tangan sahaja."Runtuhan hanya membabitkan alang konkrit tingkat atas rumah berkenaan dan bukan keseluruhan struktur rumah dua tingkat itu," katanya ketika ditemui di lokasi kejadian.Mohd Khairul berkata, susulan kejadian itu pihaknya menutup sementara kawasan berkenaan bagi membolehkan pemeriksaan lanjut dilakukan.

Beliau berkata, beberapa agensi termasuk pihak Jabatan Keselamatan dan Kesihatan Pekerjaan (JKKP) negeri yang datang membuat pemeriksaan kemudian membenarkan kerja-kerja pembersihan kawasan runtuh dilakukan hari ini dan esok dan kemudian boleh meneruskan kerja tapak selepas mengesahkan kawasan itu selamat. Katanya, operasi pihaknya tamat pada jam 4.18 petang tadi.
